## Charities supported by St Andrew's in December

Nailsea Foodbank at Southfield Church, run by members of the church, is part of the Trussell Trust's UK-wide foodbank network. Thirteen million people live below the poverty line in the UK and foodbanks help prevent crime, housing loss, family breakdown and mental health problems. Professionals such as doctors and social workers identify people experiencing a crisis and issue a voucher which can be exchanged for three days' non-perishable food.

Nailsea Foodbank is open every Friday at the Church between 12.30 pm and 2.30 pm when donations of dried and tinned food can also be received.

<u>One25</u> is a Bristol-based charity, founded in 1995, as the only organisation reaching out to women trapped in or vulnerable to street sex working. Those who wish to break free from sex work are helped to build new lives away from violence, poverty and addiction. The organisation is driven by a Christian vision and Christian values, although volunteers, supporters and service users are welcomed from all faiths and none. Jesus said, "Blessed are the peacemakers."
