Charities supported by St Andrew's in January

<u>Emmaus Bristol</u> offers homeless people a place in the Emmaus Community, where they work full-time for the Community's charitable business and are known as Companions. They collect and refurbish donated furniture and household goods, which are then sold at reasonable prices to enable the project to become self-financing. By living and working in Emmaus, people recover self-respect and are given help to move into independence. The Companions are also encouraged to look outward and have been involved in local and international charities.

<u>Samaritans</u> is an independent charity offering support to anyone with emotional concerns, worries and troubles, including those who are suicidal. Support can be over the telephone, by text, email or letter, and if needed, face to face visits. There is no time limit to the telephone call in helping the caller to explore their feelings and begin to look at their options. Samaritans has partnerships with a number of local organisations, including health services, HM Prison Bristol and Cruse.
