Epiphany Post Script

The words to As with gladness men of old were written in 1858 by William Chatterton Dix (1837-98) who was born and brought up in Bristol but spent most of this working life running an insurance company in Glasgow. He was a devout Anglican and published over 40 hymns. He died at Cheddar and is buried there at St Andrew's. His words to As with gladness were set to music by German Composer, Conrad Kocher. Dix disliked the tune intensely.
